ONLINE STUDENT SUCCESS SPECIALIST

Paige Webster joined the Title III team on May 2, 2022 as an Online Student Success Specialist. Fifty percent of her role is dedicated to the grant project in leading design, development, and pilots of online tutoring and online advising. She is also responsible for supervision of Online Peer Tutors. The additional 50% of her efforts are dedicated institutionally to performing comprehensive advising and related services for students. Paige's role allows her to coordinate with Student Services to ensure appropriate integration of newly-developed web-based services with onsite services.

ONLINE STUDENT SUCCESS SPECIALIST

Kendall Kaskie joined the Title III team on June 6, 2022 as an Online Student Success Specialist. Fifty percent of his role is dedicated to the grant project in leading the implementation efforts of the Target X retention tool within development of online tutoring system. The additional 50% of his efforts are dedicated institutionally to supporting student retention through coordinating response to early alerts and targeted interventions for at risk student populations, as well as facilitating student life activities. Kendall's role allows him to coordinate with Student Services to utilize student data from online advising tool to track student success through the retention tool and direct students as needed to online tutoring services.



ONLINE PEER TUTORS

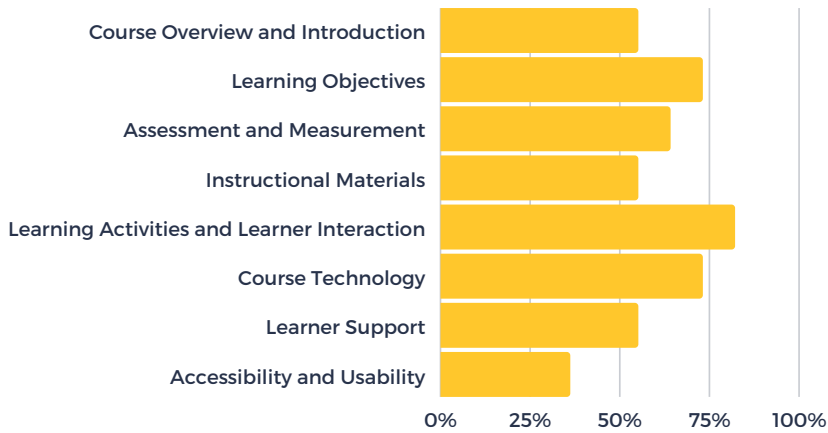
Continued search for Online Peer Tutors to assist student's in new online course pilots, utilizing technology tools and academic assistance strategies.

FACULTY QUALITY MATTERS TRAINING

Cohort 2 faculty were trained in Quality Matters guidelines and received assistance from the Title III Instructional Designer to revise courses to reflect best practices for online delivery. Faculty completed pre and post tests to rate their knowledge of best practices of online/hybrid instruction as categorized by the 8 standards of the Quality Matters rubric.

REVISED COURSE PILOT GRADES

The following courses were piloted in year 2:

- PHLE 120 Ethics
- HIST 103 History of the United States
- SPCH 103 Fundamentals of Speech
- PSYH 101 Psychology
- CITA 101 Online Student Orientation

83% of students in these courses succeeded with grades of "C" or above

FACULTY RESOURCE CENTER

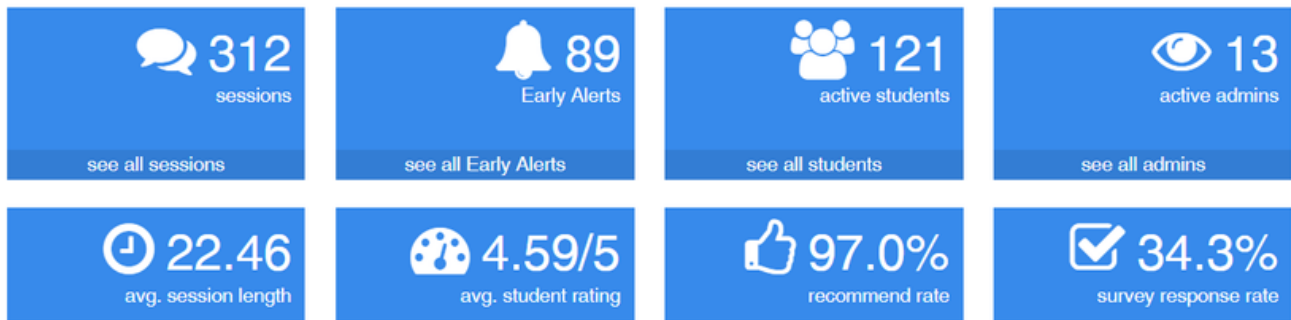

INDUSTRIAL TECHNOLOGY PILOTS

The following revised courses were piloted as online/hybrid delivery:

- INDT 105 D.C. Fundamentals
- INDT 106 A.C. Fundamentals
- INDT 111 Industrial Safety
- INDT 112 Basic Digital
- INDT 130 Basic Air Conditioning and Refrigeration
- INDT 220 Solid State

INDUSTRIAL TECHNOLOGY EQUIPMENT

The Industrial Technology department received 12 new programmable logic controller trainers and 10 new combination motor and variable frequency drive trainers.

All of these components can be integrated with other components to help students practice hands-on equipment integration skills.

All of the equipment is ethernet capable which also allows students to develop their Industry 4.0 industrial networking skills.

All of the equipment has been deployed in the Industrial Technology computer lab in Crisp room 119 to allow the students to utilize industry-level programming software.
